Viewing of SBL content will ensure children frequently encounter quality stories with rich vocabulary, text structures and language devices. With an ever-growing library of stories, visitors are sure to find a story to engage every child regardless of age, ability or background.

Language Learning Support:

SBL provides visual and audio support for the learning of English via:

- Storytellers modelling volume, tone, pace, facial expressions, body language and the addition of music and sound effects.
- Closed captions support students learning English as an Additional Language (EAL), allowing them to follow along with a text being read aloud by our storytellers.
- Many of the stories feature minimal text, repetition, rhyme and high-frequency words.
- Each story comes with tailored Classroom Ideas and/or Activity Time that are specifically created for the Australian Curriculum, supporting educators, librarians and professionals to help children make connections with the text before and after viewing the stories to help with understanding and comprehension.

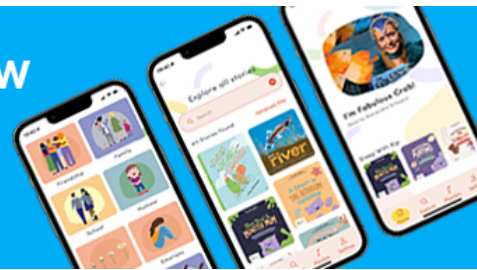
Search filters:
