The best place to watch celebrated stories read aloud by favourite Australian and New Zealand storytellers. Story Box Library (SBL) is a subscription based, trusted and safe online educational resource created for children and enjoyed by teachers, students and families around the world.



## A growing library of thoughtfully-curated and diverse stories:

Using SBL will ensure students frequently encounter quality stories with rich vocabulary, text structures and language devices. With an ever-growing library of stories, finding a story to engage every child, regardless of age, ability or background, is made easy.

## How does Story Box Library work?

SBL streams ad-free content directly into the classroom on any device with Internet connection. Use it as a facilitator for discussion, a read aloud model in the classroom or at home.

## Why was Story Box Library created?

- To deliver the precious read-aloud storytelling experience to children.
- To engage children with stories and voices, helping them to make personal connections to their world.
- To develop vital language and literacy skills.
- To combat endless online searching for quality literacy resources.

Yes! 30-40 carefully curated, thought-provoking and engaging stories are added each year.

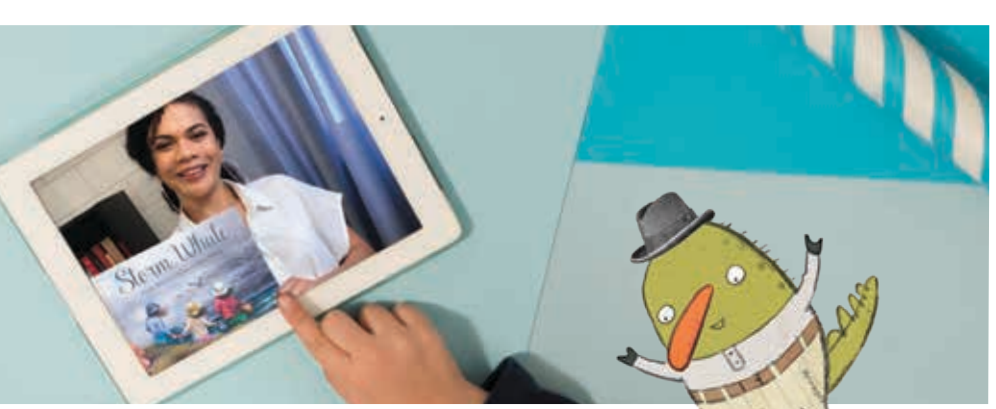
## Who are your storytellers?

## What makes SBL a good resource for your school?

- Our ever-growing library contains over 450 stories.
- Our storytellers are chosen to ensure a broad range of voices, ages, gender and backgrounds to ensure diversity.
- Digital delivery means students can access quality stories from school and home on any device with Internet access.
- With the aim of creating an immersive storytelling experience, we pair each story with a complimentary storyteller and location, and maintain a strong focus on quality video, sound and image.
- We licence rights to use the books in our collection from publishers and rights holders and a significant portion of subscription fees is used to pay ongoing copyright fees that support creators and, in turn, the ANZ publishing industry.
- Closed captions are available for each story.
- Each story is accompanied by curriculum-linked resources and creative activity ideas.
- Search by age-group, theme, author/illustrator, storyteller and duration using our search filters.
- Use our playlist feature to curate personalised lists of stories specific to the interest or needs of students.

## Support for the teaching and learning of EAL (ESOL)

- Story Box Library provides visual and audio support for the learning of English. Storytellers also model volume, tone, pace, facial expressions and body language.
- Closed captions support students learning English as an Additional Language (EAL), allowing them to follow along with a text being read aloud by our storytellers.
- Many of the stories feature minimal text, repetition, rhyme and high-frequency words.
- Each story comes with tailored Classroom Ideas and/or Activity Time that are aligned with the Australian Curriculum, supporting educators to help students make connections with the text before and after viewing the stories to help with understanding and comprehension.

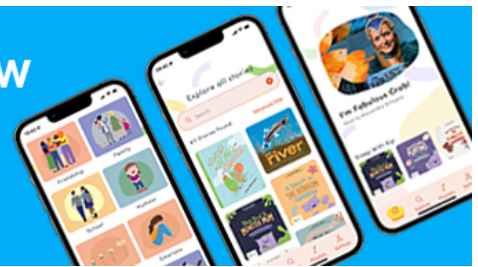
